Dust of the Earth, Sands of the Sea, Stars in Heaven... Who can number?

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Introduction

With regard to study of the bible, Torah Equity puts a preeminence on the law. A fundamental concept of law requires a study of contract (and of course covenants). Another fundamental concept in law is authority and jurisdiction. Jurisdiction are two words/concept put together, *juris* = law and diction = words, but it also has a geographical connotation to it. Normally we think of this geographical connotation as being flat or horizontal, but in Torah Equity it's takes a horizontal aspect to it. This horizontal aspect, which you need to think of first and foremost, is connected to the levels of heaven not unlike the one Paul thought of in 2Co 12:1-4.

This article also begins an investigation into three related allegorical pairs \dots 1) Dust of the Earth, 2) Sands of the Sea and 3) Stars in Heaven \dots and with them attempts to connect them in with Torah Equity i.e. are these in fact allegories describing, e.g. jurisdiction. In Torah Equity, does the two law forms "Dust of the Earth = the law of the land and Sands of the Sea = the law of the water, have a connection? And how does that relate with the Stars in the Heaven?

2nd Corinthians 12:1-4 KJV

¹ It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord. ² I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven. ³ And I knew such a man, (whether in the body, or out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) ⁴ How that he was caught up into paradise, G3857 paradeisos, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter.

Commentary

Clearly the meaning of these verses can be overly emoted making the spiritual meaning of no value or at least no value that we can do something about. Can this, however, be looked at through law to give it some meat?

Shaul (Paul) mentions in $2Co_{12:2}$ the 3rd level of heaven. Is there a connection with the hermeneutical idea of **PaRDeS** which has four levels? If the **PaRDeS** analogy is accurate, then an investigation of the third level of **PaRDeS**, which is the "D" level in Hebrew *Dalet* **T**, would be worth considering. The *Dalet* level is normally assumed to mean **D**resh as in a *midrash*. Why am I bring this up i.e. how is the relevant one might ask? It turns out that some believe that this third level is *Din* which is judgment i.e. law¹.

"...and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter"

In Torah Equity there's a principle which can crudely be articulated as "what happens in Vegas, stays in Vegas". Without looking at this through legal glasses, this doesn't make sense to me. Normally we associate "unspeakable words" as being words that are blasphemy, but if there from heaven wouldn't we want to do quite the contrary and shout them out?

I'm suggesting that the context of this chapter is Paul seeking relief from the jurisdictional third level of heaven from his accusers that are attacking him at a spiritual level. If the attack is a spiritual attack then you need to seek relief from the relevant jurisdiction, if you will, the court of original jurisdiction.

You could say that Paul is being coy by keeping what was said a secret or more simply something that which was given in private (the adjudication of the matter) needs to remain. Therefore the context of our private remedies can't be discussed in public, because the public doesn't have ears to hear i.e. it's not meant for them.

Is Paul exercising that which Y'shua taught in Matthew 18:18-20?

Matthew 18:18-20 - binding and loosening in earth and heaven

¹⁸ Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

¹⁹ Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven.

The **Third Heaven** is a division of <u>Heaven</u> in <u>religious cosmology</u>. In some traditions it is considered the <u>abode</u> of God,^[1] and in others a lower level of <u>Paradise</u>, commonly <u>one of seven</u>.^[2]

The <u>Throne of God</u> is said to be above the seventh <u>heaven</u> in <u>Abrahamic religions</u>.

A third concept of Heaven, also called *shamayi h'shamayim* (שמיה שמי) or "Heaven of Heavens") is mentioned in such passages as <u>Genesis</u> 28:12, <u>Deuteronomy</u> 10:14 and <u>1 Kings</u> 8:27 as a distinctly spiritual realm containing (or being traveled by) <u>angels</u> and God.^[4]

The ambiguity of the term *shamayim* in the Hebrew Bible, and the fact that it's a plural word, give "heavens" various interpretations regarding its nature, notably the <u>ascension of the prophet Elijah</u>.

In the <u>Second Book of Enoch</u>, Third Heaven is described as a location "between corruptibility and incorruptibility" containing the <u>Tree of Life</u>, "whereon the Lord rests, when he goes up into paradise." (chapter 8) Two springs in the Third Heaven, one of milk and the other of honey, along with two others of wine and oil, flow down into the <u>Garden of Eden</u>. (verse 6) In contrast with the common concept of <u>Paradise</u>, the <u>Second</u> <u>Book of Enoch</u> also describes a Third Heaven, "a very terrible place" with "all manner of tortures" in which merciless angels torment "those who dishonour God, who on earth practice sin against nature," including <u>sodomites</u>, <u>sorcerers</u>, <u>enchanters</u>, <u>witches</u>, the proud, thieves, liars and those guilty of various other transgressions. (chapter 10)

In the <u>Slavonic</u> version of the *Greek Apocalypse of Baruch*, also known as <u>3 Baruch</u>, the author is shown a <u>phoenix</u>, and a <u>dragon</u> residing there is said to eat the bodies of "those that have spent their lives in evil."^[5]

In *The Legends of the Jews* by <u>Louis Ginzberg</u>, this third division of Paradise is said to be, like the other six, "twelve myriads of miles in width and twelve myriads of miles in length," built of silver and gold, and containing "the best of everything there is in heaven."^[2]

New Testament

An <u>epistle</u> of the <u>Apostle Paul</u>, included in the <u>New Testament</u>, contains an explicit reference to the Third Heaven. In a letter to the <u>Corinthian church</u> he writes, "I know a man in Christ" (usually interpreted as: himself) "who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know—God knows. And I know that this man—whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows— was caught up to paradise. He heard inexpressible things, things that man is not permitted to tell." (<u>2 Corinthians</u> 12:2–4) The Greek says "caught away", not "caught up" possibly reflecting Jewish beliefs that Paradise was somewhere other than the uppermost heaven.^[6]

The apparent parallelism of the passage equates the Third Heaven with "Paradise"^[1] the traditional destination of <u>redeemed humans</u> and the general connotation of the term "Heaven" in mainstream <u>Christianity</u>.^[7]

Four allusions to the <u>Apocalypse of Moses</u> occur in close proximity in 2 Corinthians. The allusions are (i) "Satan as an angel of light",^[8] (ii) the distinction of Satan and the serpent as two beings,^{[9][10]} (iii) "Third Heaven" ^[11] (iv) "Paradise",^[12] The connection to this Jewish material has led to discussion about whether Paul accepted these traditions, or alternatively whether Paul's vision of Third Heaven is a continuation of his conflict with the <u>Superapostles</u> in the previous chapter, and that the material comes not from his own teaching, but in reply to material similar to Apocalypse of Moses being transmitted by the Superapostles to the Corinthians. Whether this is so partly depends on whether irony is detected in this section.^[13] The relationship of <u>Paul the Apostle and Judaism</u> is still widely disputed.
