God's message to Pharaoh

¹⁴ And YHVH said unto Moses,

"Pharaoh's heart is hardened, he refuseth to let the people go. $\frac{15}{6}$ Get thee unto Pharaoh in the morning; lo, he goeth out unto the water; and thou shalt stand by the river's brink against he come; and the rod which was turned to a serpent (לָנָחָשׁ le· na· Chash) shalt thou take in thine hand. $\frac{16}{6}$ And thou shalt say unto him,

'YHVH God of the Hebrews hath sent me unto thee, saying, Let my people go, that they may serve me in the wilderness: and, behold, hitherto thou wouldest not hear. ¹⁷ Thus saith YHVH, In this thou shalt know that I am YHVH: behold, I will smite with the rod that is in mine hand upon the waters which are in the river, and they shall be turned to blood. ¹⁸ And the fish that is in the river shall die, and the river shall stink; and the Egyptians shall loathe to drink of the water of the river.'

The river is turned into blood; and the consequent distress of the Egyptians

- ²⁰ And Moses and Aaron did so, as YHVH commanded; and he lifted up the rod, and smote the waters that were in the river, in the sight of Pharaoh, and in the sight of his servants; and all the waters that were in the river were turned to blood.
- ²¹ And the fish that was in the river died; and the river stank, and the Egyptians could not drink of the water of the river; and there was blood throughout all the land of Egypt.
- ²² And the magicians of Egypt did so with their enchantments: and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, neither did he hearken unto them; as YHVH had said.
- ²³ And Pharaoh turned and went into his house, neither did he set his heart to this also.
- ²⁴ And all the Egyptians digged round about the river for water to drink; for they could not drink of the water of the river.
- ²⁵ And seven days were fulfilled, after that YHVH had smitten the river.

¹⁹ And YHVH spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and stretch out thine hand upon the waters of Egypt, upon their streams, upon their rivers, and upon their ponds, and upon all their pools of water, that they may become blood; and that there may be blood throughout all the land of Egypt, both in vessels of wood, and in vessels of stone.

- 8:1 And YHVH spake unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith YHVH, Let my people go, that they may serve me.
- ² And if thou refuse to let them go, behold, I will smite all thy borders with frogs:
- ³ And the river shall bring forth frogs abundantly, which shall go up and come into thine house, and into thy bedchamber, and upon thy bed, and into the house of thy servants, and upon thy people, and into thine ovens, and into thy kneadingtroughs:
- ⁴ And the frogs shall come up both on thee, and upon thy people, and upon all thy servants.
- ⁵ And YHVH spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Stretch forth thine hand with thy rod over the streams, over the rivers, and over the ponds, and cause frogs to come up upon the land of Egypt.
- ⁶ And Aaron stretched out his hand over the waters of Egypt; and the frogs came up, and covered the land of Egypt.
- And the magicians did so with their enchantments, and brought up frogs upon the land of Egypt.

Pharaoh complains to Moses, who by prayer removes them

- ⁸ Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron, and said, Entreat YHVH, that he may take away the frogs from me, and from my people; and I will let the people go, that they may do sacrifice unto YHVH.
- ² And Moses said unto Pharaoh, Glory over me: when shall I entreat for thee, and for thy servants, and for thy people, to destroy the frogs from thee and thy houses, that they may remain in the river only?
- ¹⁰ And he said, To morrow. And he said, Be it according to thy word: that thou mayest know that there is none like unto YHVH our God.
- ¹¹ And the frogs shall depart from thee, and from thy houses, and from thy servants, and from thy people; they shall remain in the river only.
- ¹² And Moses and Aaron went out from Pharaoh: and Moses cried unto YHVH because of the frogs which he had brought against Pharaoh.
- ¹³ And YHVH did according to the word of Moses; and the frogs died out of the houses, out of the villages, and out of the fields.
- ¹⁴ And they gathered them together upon heaps: and the land stank.
- ¹⁵ But when Pharaoh saw that there was respite, he hardened his heart, and hearkened not unto them; as YHVH had said.

The dust is turned into lice, which the magicians could not do

- ¹⁶ And YHVH said unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Stretch out thy rod, and smite the dust of the land, that it may become lice throughout all the land of Egypt.
- ¹⁷ And they did so; for Aaron stretched out his hand with his rod, and smote the dust of the earth, and it became lice in man, and in beast; all the dust of the land became lice throughout all the land of Egypt.

- ¹⁸ And the magicians did so with their enchantments to bring forth lice, but they could not: so there were lice upon man, and upon beast.
- ¹⁹ Then the magicians said unto Pharaoh, This is the finger of God: and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he hearkened not unto them; as YHVH had said.
