Plagues of Locusts and Darkness God threatens to send locusts

¹And YHVH said unto Moses,

"Go in unto Pharaoh: for I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that I might show these my signs (אֹתֹתָי ^{o· to· Tai}) before him: ² And that thou mayest tell in the ears of thy son, and of thy son's son, what things I have wrought in Egypt, and my signs which I have done among them; that ye may know how that I am YHVH." ^B [Deu 6:20-22; Joel 1:3]

 3 And Moses and Aaron came in unto Pharaoh, and said unto him,

Num 14:2-3² And all the children of Israel murmured against Moses and against Aaron: and the whole congregation said unto them, Would God that we had died in the land of Egypt! or would God we had died in this wilderness! ³ And wherefore hath <u>YHVH brought us unto this land, to fall by the sword, that our wives and our children should be a prey?</u> were it not better for us to return into Egypt?

"Stretch out thine hand over the land of Egypt for the locusts, that they may come up upon the land of Egypt, and eat every herb of the land, אָת even all that the hail hath left."

Pharaoh entreats Moses

 $\frac{16}{16}$ Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron in haste; and he said,

The plague of darkness

Pharaoh again entreats Moses, but yet is hardened

The foolishness of their princes

¹¹ Surely the princes of Zoan are fools, the counsel of the wise counsellors of Pharaoh is become brutish: how say ye unto Pharaoh, I am the son of the wise, the son of ancient kings? ¹² Where are they? where are thy wise men? and let them tell thee now, and let them know what YHVH of hosts hath purposed upon Egypt. ¹³ The princes of Zoan are become fools, the princes of Noph are deceived; they have also seduced Egypt, even they that are the stay of the tribes thereof. ¹⁴ YHVH hath mingled a perverse spirit in the midst thereof: and they have caused Egypt to err in every work thereof, as a drunken man staggereth in his vomit. ¹⁵ Neither shall there be any work for Egypt, which the head or tail, branch or rush, may do. ¹⁶ In that day shall Egypt be like unto women: and it shall be afraid and fear because of the shaking of the hand of YHVH of hosts, which he shaketh over it. ¹⁷ And the land of Judah shall be a terror unto Egypt, every one that maketh mention thereof shall be afraid in himself, because of the counsel of YHVH of hosts, which he hath determined against it.
