And the servant put his hand under the thigh (Ye·rech בֶּרֶלְיָב) of Abraham his master, and sware (vai·yish·Sha·va אַבע) to him concerning that matter.

Joh 4:7-15 18 And she said, Drink, my lord: and she hasted, and let down her pitcher upon her hand, and gave him drink. <sup>19</sup> And when she had done giving him drink, she said, I will draw water for thy camels also, until they have done drinking. Heb 13:1-2 20 And she hasted, and emptied her pitcher into the trough, and ran again j unto the well to

draw *water*, and drew for all his camels. <sup>21</sup> And the man wondering at her held his peace, to wit whether YHVH had made his journey prosperous or not.

22 And it came to pass, as the camels had done drinking, that the man took a golden earring of half a shekel (beqa בָּקע) weight, and two bracelets for her hands of ten shekels weight of gold; 1

<sup>24</sup> And she said unto him, I *am* the daughter of Bethuel the son of Milcah, which she bare unto Nahor. <sup>25</sup> She said moreover unto him, We have both straw and provender <sup>m</sup> enough, and room to lodge in. <sup>26</sup> And the man bowed down his head, and worshipped YHVH. <sup>27</sup> And he said, Blessed *be* YHVH God of my master Abraham, who hath not left destitute my master of his mercy and his truth: I *being* in the way (*derek* H1870), YHVH led me to the house of my master's brethren. <sup>n</sup> <sup>28</sup> And the damsel ran, and told *them of* her mother's house these things. <sup>29</sup> And Rebekah had a brother, and his name *was* Laban: and Laban ran out unto the man, unto the well. <sup>30</sup> And it came to pass, when he saw the earring and bracelets upon his sister's hands, and when he heard the words of Rebekah his sister, saying, Thus spake the man unto me; that he came unto the man; and, behold, he stood by the camels at the well. <sup>31</sup> And he said, Come in, thou blessed of YHVH; wherefore standest thou without? for I have prepared the house, and room for the camels. <sup>32</sup> And the man came into the house: and he ungirded his camels, and gave straw and provender for the camels, and water to wash his feet, and the men's feet that *were* with him.

And he said, I *am* Abraham's servant. <sup>35</sup> And YHVH hath blessed my master greatly; and he is become great: and he hath given him flocks, and herds, and silver, and gold, and menservants, and maidservants, and camels, and asses. <sup>36</sup> And Sarah my master's wife bare a son to my master when she was old: and unto him hath he given all that he hath. <sup>37</sup> And my master made me swear (*shava* H7650), saying, Thou shalt not take a wife to my son of the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I dwell: <sup>38</sup> But thou shalt go unto my father's house, and to my kindred, and take a wife unto my son. <sup>39</sup> And I said unto my master, Peradventure the woman will not follow me. <sup>40</sup> And he said unto me, YHVH, before whom I walk, will send his angel with thee, and prosper thy way; and thou shalt take a wife for my son of my kindred, and of my father's house: <sup>41</sup> Then shalt thou be clear from *this* my oath, when thou comest to my kindred; and if they give not thee *one*, thou shalt be clear from my oath.

## Eph 5:15-33 - Be Imitators of God; Love and Respect between Husbands and Wives

<sup>15</sup> See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, <sup>16</sup> Redeeming the time, because the days are evil. <sup>17</sup> Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of YHVH is. <sup>18</sup> And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit; <sup>19</sup> Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to YHVH; <sup>20</sup> Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; <sup>21</sup> Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God. <sup>22</sup> Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto YHVH. <sup>23</sup> For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body. <sup>24</sup> Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in every thing. <sup>25</sup> Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; <sup>26</sup> That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, <sup>27</sup> That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish. <sup>28</sup> So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself. <sup>29</sup> For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as YHVH the church: <sup>30</sup> For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones. <sup>31</sup> For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh. <sup>32</sup> This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church. <sup>33</sup> Nevertheless let every one of you in particular so love his wife even as himself; and the wife see that she reverence her husband.
