The fourth and final question is do you believe you are Israel and therefore bound to the covenant? If yes, then you have passed all the tests...let's talk.

Answering affirmative to these questions are dependent on what I call Covenant Conservatism. To discuss the details of it would be a waste of time for all parties concerned. As a software developer who is starting a new project, I like the maxim “if you going to fail, fail early”. If you fail to meet this questions there is no point in continuing, that's why I'm asking them early in the conversation.

As the title suggests, I stipulate that the minimum theological requirements have been met, and the determining factor proceeding forward is no longer theology but about your performance to the binding contract/covenant. This is very powerful because it brings great clarity in walking out your faith because it bypasses all the trappings of theology. Defining faith becomes very simple. The question of do you have faith boils down to “do you actually believe that YHVH, the Creator, will do what he said he will do pursuant to the contract/covenant?”
