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Introduction

Numbers chapter 8 Num 8:1-26

How the lamps are to be lighted

¹ And YHVH spake unto Moses, saying,^A ² Speak unto Aaron, and say unto him, When thou lightest the lamps, the seven lamps shall give light over against the candlestick. ³ And Aaron did so; he lighted the lamps thereof over against the candlestick, as YHVH commanded Moses. ⁴ And this work of the candlestick *was of* beaten gold, unto the shaft thereof, unto the flowers thereof, *was* beaten work: according unto the pattern which YHVH had shewed Moses, so he made the candlestick.^B

⁵ And YHVH spake unto Moses, saying, ⁶ Take the Levites from among the children of Israel, and cleanse them. ⁷ And thus shalt thou do unto them, to cleanse them: Sprinkle water of purifying upon them, and let them shave all their flesh, and let them wash their clothes, and *so* make themselves clean. ⁸ Then let them take a young bullock with his meat offering, *even* fine flour mingled with oil, and another young bullock shalt thou take for a sin offering. ⁹ And thou shalt bring the Levites before the tabernacle of the congregation: and thou shalt gather the whole assembly of the children of Israel together: ¹⁰ And thou shalt bring the Levites before YHVH: and the children of Israel shall put their hands upon the Levites:^C

¹¹ And Aaron shall offer the Levites before YHVH for an offering of the children of Israel, that they may execute the service of YHVH. ¹² And the Levites shall lay their hands upon the heads of the bullocks: and thou shalt offer the one *for* a sin offering, and the other *for* a burnt offering, unto YHVH, to make an atonement for the Levites. ¹³ And thou shalt set the Levites before Aaron, and before his sons, and offer them *for* an offering unto YHVH. ¹⁴ Thus shalt thou separate הָבְדַלָת ^{ve hiv dal Ta} אָת ^{et-} the Levites from among the children of Israel: and the Levites shall be mine.^{D 15} And after that shall the Levites go in to do the service of the tabernacle of the congregation: and thou shalt cleanse them, and offer them for an offering.^{E 16} For they are wholly given unto me from among the children of Israel; instead of such as open every womb, even instead of the firstborn of all the children of Israel, have I taken them unto me.^{F 17} For all the firstborn of the children of Israel *are* mine, *both* man and beast: on the day that I smote every firstborn in the land of Egypt I sanctified them for myself.¹⁸ And I have taken the Levites for all the firstborn of the children of Israel. ¹⁹ And I have given the Levites as a gift to Aaron and to his sons from among the children of Israel, to do the service of the children of Israel in the tabernacle of the congregation, and to make an atonement for the children of Israel: that there be no plague among the children of Israel, when the children of Israel come nigh unto the sanctuary.²⁰ And Moses, and Aaron, and all the congregation of the children of Israel, did to the Levites according unto all that YHVH commanded Moses concerning the Levites, so did the children of Israel unto them. ²¹ And the Levites were purified, and they washed their clothes; and Aaron offered them as an offering before YHVH; and Aaron made an atonement for them to cleanse them. ²² And after that went the Levites in to do their service in the tabernacle of the congregation before Aaron, and before his sons: as YHVH had commanded Moses concerning the Levites, so did they unto them.

The age and time of their service

²³ And YHVH spake unto Moses, saying, ²⁴ This *is it* that *belongeth* unto the Levites: from twenty and five years ^G old and upward they shall go in to wait upon the service of the tabernacle of the congregation: ²⁵ And from the age of fifty years they shall cease waiting upon the service *thereof*, and shall serve no more: ²⁶ But shall minister with their brethren in the tabernacle of the congregation, to keep the charge, and shall do no service. Thus shalt thou do unto the Levites touching their charge.

Numbers Chapter 9 Num 9:1-23

The Passover is again commanded

¹ And YHVH spake unto Moses in the wilderness of Sinai, in the first month of the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt, saying, ² Let the children of Israel also keep the passover at his appointed season. ³ In the fourteenth day of this month, at even, ye shall keep it in his appointed season: according to all the rites of it, and according to all the ceremonies thereof, shall ye keep it. ⁴ And Moses spake unto the children of Israel, that they should keep the passover. ⁵ And they kept the passover on the fourteenth day of the first month at even in the wilderness of Sinai: according to all that YHVH commanded Moses, so did the children of

⁶ And there were certain men, who were defiled by the dead body of a man, that they could not keep the passover on that day: and they came before Moses and before Aaron on that day: ⁷ And those men said unto him, We *are* defiled by the dead body of a man: wherefore are we kept back, that we may not offer an offering of YHVH in his appointed season among the children of Israel? ⁸ And Moses said unto them, Stand still, and I will hear what YHVH will command concerning you. ⁹ And YHVH spake unto Moses, saying, ¹⁰ Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, If any man of you or of your posterity shall be unclean by reason of a dead body, ^H or *be* in a journey afar off, yet he shall keep the passover unto YHVH. ¹¹ The fourteenth day of the second month at even they shall keep it, *and* eat it with unleavened bread and bitter *herbs*. ¹² They shall leave none of it unto the morning, nor break any bone of it: according to all the ordinances of the passover, even the same soul shall be cut off from among his people: because he brought not the offering of YHVH in his appointed season, that man shall bear his sin. ¹⁴ And if a stranger shall sojourn among you, and will keep the passover unto YHVH; according to the ordinance of the passover, and according to the manner thereof, so shall he do: ye shall have one ordinance, both for the stranger, and for him that was born in the land.¹

The cloud directs the removals and encampments of the Israelites

¹⁵ And on the day that the tabernacle was reared up the cloud covered the tabernacle, *namely*, the tent of the testimony: and at even there was upon the tabernacle as it were the appearance of fire, until the morning. 16 So it was alway: the cloud covered it by day, and the appearance of fire by night.^J ¹⁷ And when the cloud was taken up from the tabernacle, then after that the children of Israel journeyed: and in the place where the cloud abode, there the children of Israel pitched their tents. ¹⁸ At the commandment of YHVH the children of Israel journeyed, and at the commandment of YHVH they pitched: as long as the cloud abode upon the tabernacle they rested in their tents. ¹⁹ And when the cloud tarried long upon the tabernacle many days, then the children of Israel kept the charge of YHVH, and journeyed not. ²⁰ And *so* it was, when the cloud was a few days upon the tabernacle; according to the commandment of YHVH they abode in their tents, and according to the commandment of YHVH they journeyed. ²¹ And *so* it was, when the cloud abode from even unto the morning, and *that* the cloud was taken up in the morning, then they journeyed: whether *it was* by day or by night that the cloud was taken up, they journeyed. ²² Or *whether it were* two days, or a month, or a year, that the cloud tarried upon the tabernacle, remaining thereon, the children of Israel abode in their tents, and journeyed not: but when it was taken up, they journeyed. ²³ At the commandment of YHVH they rested in the tents, and at the commandment of YHVH they journeyed: they kept the charge of YHVH, at the commandment of YHVH by the hand of Moses.

Rev 11:1-19 (chapter 11) The Two Witnesses & the 7th Trump

The two witnesses prophesy.

¹ And there was given me a reed like unto a rod: and the angel stood, saying, Rise, and measure the temple of God, and the altar, and them that worship therein. ² But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles: and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months. ³ And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore²⁶⁰ days, clothed in sackcloth. ⁴ These are the two² olive trees, ^Q and the two² candlesticks standing before the God of the earth. ⁵ And if any man will hurt them, fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed.
