⁴ Ω Trop is the Hebrew word that is transliterated as *pardes*. See Strong's # H6508 "Of foreign origin; a park: - forest, orchard.". The KJ Concordance usage for H6508 shows three instances where the translations are 1) forest, 1 Neh 2:8; 2) orchard, 1 Son 4:13; & 3) orchards, 1 Ecc 2:5. The only LXX cross-reference for H6508 strong's #G3857 paradeisos...and obvious Greek transliteration.

⁵ PaRDeS is an acronym using the transliterated English letters P, R, D & S. see Word-Study-H6508-PaRDeS-G3857-Paradeisos.doc

⁶ Strong's **HH6584** (spelled without the Aleph), see "Word-Study-Pashat-H6584.doc" <u>Gen 37:23</u> "And it came to pass, when Joseph was come unto his brethren, that they **stripped** ^{H6584 (H853)} Joseph out of ^(H853) his coat, *his* ^(H853) coat of *many* colors that was on him;"

⁷ "Some thinkers, such as the Tolaat Yaakov, divide Pardes into **Peshat**, **Remez**, <u>**Din**</u> (**law**), and **Sod**. According to this understanding, Derash is divided into the homiletics, which are classified under Remez, and legal interpretations, which are classified under Din" <u>source</u>. Since my passion is Torah as a law form (Torah Equity as I call it) I find this very interesting.

⁸ Strong's **#H1875**; "A primitive root; properly to tread or frequent; usually to follow (for pursuit or search); by implication to seek or ask; specifically to worship: - ask, X at all, care for, X diligently, inquire, make inquisition, [necro-] mancer, question, require, search, seek [for, out], X surely."

Sample verses: **Gen 9:5** KJV "And surely your blood of your lives will I require ^{H1875}; at the hand of every beast will I require ^{H1875} it, and at the hand of man; at the hand of every man's brother will I require ^{H1875} the life of man." Gen 9:5 is the first place this word is found (i.e. H1857 is found) and it's used three times. **Deu 18:19** KJV "And it shall come to pass, that whosoever will not hearken unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require ^{H1875} it of him." Sample verse Gen 49:6 (first use) where Jacob is prophesying over Simeon and Levi **Gen 49:6** KJV "O my soul, come not thou into their secret; ^{H5475} unto their assembly, ^{H6951 QaHaL}, mine honour, be not thou united: for in their anger they slew a man, and in their selfwill they digged down a wall.
