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

**Deu 24: 8-9** <sup>8</sup> Take heed in the plague of leprosy, that thou observe diligently, and do according to all that the priests the Levites shall teach you: as I commanded them, so ye shall observe to do. <sup>9</sup> Remember **Aleph Tav** what YHVH thy Elohim did unto Miriam by the way, after that ye were come forth out of Egypt.



## **Noteworthy points on leprosy**

- 1. The standalone Aleph Tav is found in verse Deu 24:9 and the subject in Deu 24:8-9 is leprosy. Specifically it talks about the leprosy of Miriam originally told in Numbers 12.
- 2. The very detailed instruction on dealing with leprosy is found in chapters 13 & 14 of Leviticus.
- 3. The testimony of Y'shua of healing the leper is found four times in the Brit Chadasha see <u>Y'shua healing lepers</u>.
- 4. There are five Standalone Aleph Tav's found in chapters 13 & 14 of Leviticus (see <u>Five Aleph Tavs in Lev 13:12, 13:54, 13:57 14:11; 14:31</u>).

## Is there prophecy about the Messiah healing lepers?

Last Shabbath, we had a question about how do we know in scripture that a sign of Meshiach was to heal the leper and also where in scripture is it prophesized. Y'shua says in Mat 11:5 "the lepers are cleansed" and I thought that referred to Isa 61:1 (and other verses), but I was wrong. There is no verse that specifically deals with the healing the leper(s) (see Mat 11-5 and related prophecy).

It is my understanding that because there was such detail in dealing with the leprosy (two whole chapters on the subject is a lot in the Torah) and the fact that no (Israelite) leper had ever been healed, the sages of old concluded that that would be the act of the Messiah (ref?). Note however that there is a lot of commentary using leprosy as a metaphor that, for example, may point to the redemptive work of Messiah, but no explicit verse stating that the Messiah will heal lepers.

In the gospel accounts of Y'shua healing the lepers, Y'shua makes a point in these verses that after the leper is cleansed to go to the priest for confirmation. Why does he do this? The simple answer is because this is required in Torah (which shows that he is in alignment with Torah as opposed to replacing it). I'm also contending that Y'shua is sending a cleansed leper as a messenger with the implied message to the priest that a messianic act has occurred. The act of Y'shua healing the leper is evidence to the priest that he is the Messiah, but the question still remains where in scripture is this prophesized?

#### My response to the question

Upon further research I remembered a teaching from Monte Judah where Moshe in Exodus 4:6-11 makes his hand leprous and he then heals it. In those verses YHVH is telling Moshe that this act should be evidence to Pharaoh and his Israelite brethren that he is operating under the power and authority of YHVH the Creator of the universe. Monte's point was that a sign of Meshiach would be where someone did things like Moshe. Since I believe that the standalone Aleph Tav is a "pointer" to the Messiah I also offer as a response the (standalone) Aleph Tav's of Lev 13 & 14 and Deu 24:9 as evidence.

#### The declaration in Mat 11:5 of the acts of the Messiah

#### Exo 4:6-11

<sup>6</sup> And YHVH said furthermore unto him, Put now thine hand into thy bosom. And he put his hand into his bosom: and when he took it out, behold, his hand *was* leprous as snow. <sup>7</sup> And he said, Put thine hand into thy bosom again. And he put his hand into his bosom again; and plucked it out of his bosom, and, behold, it was turned again as his *other* flesh. <sup>8</sup> And it shall come to pass, if they will not believe thee, neither hearken to the voice of the first sign, that they will believe the voice of the latter sign. <sup>9</sup> And it shall come to pass, if they will not believe also these two signs, neither hearken unto thy voice, that thou shalt take of the water of the river, and pour *it* upon the dry *land*: and the water which thou takest out of the river shall become blood upon the dry *land*. <sup>10</sup> And Moses said unto YHVH, O Adonai, I *am* not eloquent, neither heretofore, nor since thou hast spoken unto thy servant: but I *am* slow of speech, and of a slow tongue. <sup>11</sup> And YHVH said unto him, Who hath made man's mouth? or who maketh the dumb, or deaf, or the seeing, or the blind? have not I YHVH?

#### Comments on Exo 4:6-11

This article is about leprosy as is stated in Mat 11:5, but Mat 11:5 talks about other things that Meshiach will do like healing the blind and the deaf for example. In Exo 4:10-11 YHVH is trying to convince Moshe to trust in him and rationalizes with him from the perspective as the Creator. YHVH is dismissing Moshe's argument for not wanting to be YHVH's agent because of his less than perfect mouth and states as the Creator of the mouth it is but a small thing to repair it. The connection with Mat 11:5 in part is that YHVH also says he can fix the blind and the dumb. Yet another sign of Meshiach is turning water into wine (metaphor for blood) which is hinted at with Exo 4:9.

## The five standalone Aleph Tav's found in Lev 13 & 14
