One who participates in the same lot, a joint heir ([Rom 8:17](#)). In [Heb 11:9](#), it speaks of Isaac and Jacob in their relation to Abraham; in [1Pe 3:7](#), of women as being joint heirs with their husbands of the grace of life; in [Eph 3:6](#), of the Gentiles being joint heirs with Israel (see [Eph 1:11](#)).
