(I) Of place: from above, from a higher place (Mat 27:51; Mar 15:38; Joh 19:23). Used in substitution of ouranóthen (G3771), from heaven, or ek toú ouranoú (ek [G1537], from; toú ouranoú [G3772], the heaven), from the heaven, from God since God dwells in heaven. In Joh 3:3, Joh 3:7, Joh 3:31; Joh 19:11; Jas 1:17, the meaning is from God, implied in the "from above." The wisdom from above in Jas 3:17 is the heavenly or divine wisdom (cf. Jas 3:15; Sept.: Exo 28:27; Job 3:4).

(II) Of time:

(A) From the first, from the beginning (<u>Luk 1:3; Act 26:5</u>, knowing me from the first [ánothen], from the earliest age; <u>Gal 4:9</u>, again, from the very beginning, as if you had never been a Christian).

(**B**) Again, another time as in <u>Joh 3:3</u>, <u>Joh 3:7</u>, "be born again." This could also be translated "to be born from above." Both meanings are correct since this is a birth from God and it is a new birth. In <u>Joh 3:4</u>, Nicodemus clearly takes it to mean to be born a second time (deúteron [G1208]).

a. from above, from a higher place: ἀπόἄνωθεν (Winer's Grammar, § 50, 7 N. 1), Matthew 27:51 [Tdf. omits ἀπό]; Mark 15:38; ἐκ τῶν ἄνωθεν from the upper part, from the top, John 19:23. Often (also in Greek writings) used of things which come from heaven, or from God as dwelling in heaven: John 3:31; John 19:11; James 1:17; James 3:15, 17.
