Strong's From <u>G757</u> and <u>G32</u>; a *chief angel:* - archangel.

## WordStudy ®

archággelos; gen. archaggélou, masc. noun from árchōn (G758), chief, and ággelos (G32), angel or messenger. The first or highest angel, the archangel, leader of the angels. See <u>Dan 10:13</u>; <u>Dan 12:1</u>. Of these angels there are said to be seven who stand immediately before the throne of God (<u>Luk 1:19</u>; <u>Rev 8:2</u>), who have authority over other angels (<u>Rev 12:7</u>), and are the patrons of particular nations (<u>Dan 10:13</u>; <u>Dan 12:1</u>). The names of two only are found in the Scriptures: Michael, the patron of the Jewish nation (<u>Dan 10:13</u>, <u>Dan 10:21</u>; <u>Dan 12:1</u>; <u>Jud 1:9</u>; <u>Rev 12:7</u>), and Gabriel (<u>Dan 8:16</u>; <u>Dan 9:21</u>; <u>Luk 1:19</u>, <u>Luk 1:26</u>). The term "archangel" denotes a definite rank by virtue of which one is qualified for special work and service. The archangel, head or ruler of the angels, sometimes denotes Christ being the God-Man (<u>1Th 4:16</u> [cf. <u>Joh 5:25-27</u>]; <u>Jud 1:9</u> [cf. <u>Zec 3:2</u>]).
