Word Study ® A verb meaning to be wise, to act according to wisdom, to make wise decisions, to manifest wisdom. This word is used to convey the act of instructing which if received brings wisdom (Job 35:11; Psa 105:22); the wise activity that derives from such instruction (Pro 6:6; Pro 8:33); the way of conduct contrary to that of the wicked (Pro 23:19); the wisdom manifested in the animal kingdom (Pro 30:24). In the reflexive sense, the verb implies the tangible manifestation of wisdom (Ecc 2:19); the exaggerated perception of one's own wisdom (Ecc 7:16); and the cunning activities of the deceiver (Exo 1:10). The psalmist declares that the Lord delights in dispensing wisdom to the simpleminded (Psa 19:7 [8]).

Strong's: A primitive root, to *be wise* (in mind, word or act): - X exceeding, teach wisdom, be (make self, shew self) wise, deal (never so) wisely, make wiser.

(how about Pro 21:30), Psa 33:10, Psa 33:11. Zoan was the capital of Egypt, and noted for wisdom. But compare God's comment in Isa 19:11-13; and Psa 78:12-13.
