Exo 32:18 KJV

And he said, *It is* not the voice of *them that* shout for mastery, neither *is it* the voice of *them that* cry for being overcome מַלוּשָׁה cha-lu-Shah: but the noise of *them that* sing do I hear.

I'm thinking that this word might be related **to the Jealous Husband** (**Num 5:19-28**) where if the suspected wife is guilty bad things happen to her. "²¹ ... doth make thy thigh to rot, and thy belly to swell; ²² and this water that causeth the curse shall go into thy bowels, to make thy belly to swell, and thy thigh to rot:..."

In Exo 32:18, it appears that Joshua is getting a mixed message and therefore supports Glenn McWilliams's idea that it was unclear what the intent was of the molten/golden calf.

H2476 chalushah KJC:1 overcome Exo 32:18

Strong's: Feminine passive participle of H2522; defeat: - being overcome.

WordStudy: A feminine noun referring to a defect, a weakness. It refers to the state or condition of one who has been defeated (Exo 32:18), of one who cries out because of defeat in battle.

H2522 chalash KJC:3 discomfited Exo 32:18 wasteth Job 14:10, weaken Sa 14:12

Strong's: A primitive root; to prostrate; by implication to overthrow, decay: - discomfit, waste away, weaken.

WordStudy: A verb meaning to lie prostrate, to cause one to lie prostrate. It means to weaken or overwhelm one's enemy in battle (Exo 17:13). It takes on the sense of to disappear, lying prostrate, dead, or totally weakened (Job 14:10) when referring to an individual. The star of morning, the king of Babylon, was known as one who weakened, incapacitated the other nations of the world (Isa 14:12).
