

Word Study H3533 *KaBaSh* and H3536 *KiBShaN* Furnace

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Introduction

YHVH is “putting the kibosh” on the activities of Sodom and Gomorrah.

Gen 19:28 Sodom and Gomorrah..went up as the smoke of a furnace.

²⁸ And he looked toward Sodom and Gomorrah, and toward all the land of the plain, and beheld, and, lo, the smoke of the country went up as the smoke *QiToR* ^{H7008} of a furnace *KiBShoN* ^{H3536}.

Word comparison: The word furnace is different from the one used in [Gen 15:17](#) which is [H8574 TaNNuR](#).

A primitive root; to *tread* down; hence negatively to *disregard*; positively to *conquer*, *subjugate*, *violate*: - bring into bondage, force, keep under, subdue, bring into subjection.

In [Gen 1:28](#) KoBHahSH is rendered "to master" or "subdue." KeeBOOSH, the noun form, means "conquest." The Kahf-Bet/Bhet-Shin/Sin root is seen at [OVIS](#), where the quintessentially docile, domesticated or cowed creature is the KeBHeS, lamb.
