Word Study

A masculine noun meaning a rod, a stick, a staff. It refers to a rod, a stick, a staff of wood for various uses: Jacob cut rods from poplar and peeled white stripes in them for use in a mysterious breeding process (<u>Gen 30:37-39</u>, <u>Gen 30:41</u>); a walking stick or shepherd's stick (<u>Gen 32:10</u> [11]; <u>Exo 12:11</u>; <u>1Sa 17:40</u>); a prodding or riding rod (<u>Num 22:27</u>); a weapon (<u>Eze 39:9</u>). It is used figuratively of covenants with Israel and Judah (<u>Zec 11:7</u>, <u>Zec 11:10</u>, <u>Zec 11:14</u>). Hosea describes it as a kind of staff or wand used by a sorcerer or diviner (<u>Hos 4:12</u>). It is used symbolically several more times (<u>Jer 1:11</u>; <u>Jer 48:17</u> [of Moab]).
