## H6413 *peleytah* <sup>KJC:28</sup> escape<sup>22</sup>, deliverance<sup>5</sup>, remnant<sup>1</sup>

Feminine of [H6412](#); *deliverance*; concretely an *escaped* portion: - deliverance, (that is) escape (-d), remnant.

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**p<sup>e</sup>lēyṭāh**: A feminine noun meaning deliverance, something delivered, a remnant. Jacob split his group into two camps so that if Esau attacked one, the other could escape ([Gen 32:8](#) [9]). Joseph told his brothers that God used what they meant for evil to be deliverance for them ([Gen 45:7](#)). Moses told Pharaoh that the locusts would eat whatever was left from the hail ([Exo 10:5](#)). The Israelites looked for wives for the BenJasites who were left ([Jdg](#)

21:17). David had everyone flee, or no one would be safe from Absalom (2Sa 15:14).

It indicates persons or groups who have lived through a dangerous situation; survivors or those who have escaped what might have been sure death; fugitives (Gen 14:13; Jos 8:22; 2Ki 9:15, etc.).

II. A masculine noun indicating a refugee, a survivor. It is the same as I. In context it refers to Moabite fugitives (Num 21:29); and to a group of survivors in the time when God will restore His people and the nations (Isa 66:19).

It can be used to depict a deliverer, one who helps to escape ([2Sa 22:2](#)). It describes deliverance or rescue from threatening situations ([2Sa 22:44](#)). It signifies survivors who have escaped, gotten away safely in time of danger ([Eze 7:16](#)). It means to give birth to a calf, to calve ([Job 21:10](#)). It means to be given a legal judgment of freedom, a clearance ([Job 23:7](#)). It describes the Lord's deliverance of the psalmist's life from oppressors ([Psa 17:13](#)). In its causative usage, it means to take to safety, to deliver ([Isa 5:29](#); [Mic 6:14](#)).

**H4422 malat** <sup>KJC:97</sup> **escape50, deliver33, save5, etc.**

A primitive root; properly to *be smooth*, that is, (by implication) to *escape* (as if by *slipperiness*); causatively to *release* or *rescue*; specifically to *bring forth* young, *emit* sparks: - deliver (self), escape, lay, leap out, let alone, let go, preserve, save, X speedily, X surely.

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*mālaṭ*: A verb meaning to escape. The picture of escape is as sparks leaping out of the fire ([Job 41:19](#) [11]); or like a bird escaping the fowlers ([Psa 124:7](#)). This word is usually used within the context of fleeing for one's life as Lot was urged to do ([Gen 19:17](#), [Gen 19:19-20](#), [Gen 19:22](#)); as David did from the hands of Saul ([1Sa 19:10-12](#); [1Sa 27:1](#)); or as Zedekiah could not do when facing the Chaldeans ([Jer 32:4](#); [Jer 34:3](#)). It is also used to describe rescue from death ([Est 4:13](#); [Psa 89:48](#) [49]; [Amo 2:14-15](#)); calamity ([Job 1:15-17](#), [Job 1:19](#)); or punishment ([Pro 11:21](#); [Pro 19:5](#); [Pro 28:26](#)). In a few instances, the word is used to describe protection ([Ecc 9:15](#); [Isa 31:5](#)); in one instance, it means to give birth to a child ([Isa 66:7](#)).
